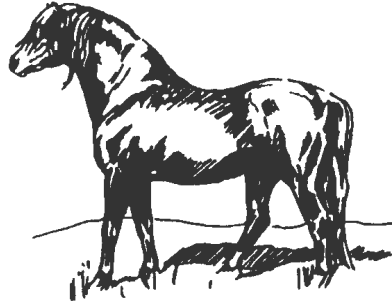

NPS Membership Criteria for the Breed Show

- Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members & non-members & at Breed Shows ponies can qualify for the final even if their owners are not NPS members.
- The owner of a pony qualifying at a Breed Show must become an NPS Qualifying member for the pony to enter the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show in August 2017.
- At Breed Shows ponies can win Silver Medal Rosettes even if their owners are not members of the NPS but they must become NPS Qualifying members to enter the 2017 final.

NPS Silver Medal Rosette Championships

These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette but the qualification card goes to the Reserve Champion pony. The Silver Medal Rosette and the qualification card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve (third). Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Championships.

Class 2 Covered Mare, 4 years old and over without foal but with Service Certificate for the current year.

Class 3 Novice Stallion, 4 years old and over. Not to have won a first prize in a Dartmoor stallion class at a Star Show prior to 1st January of the current year.

Class 4 Open Stallion, 4 years old and over.
The Brandsby Tornado Challenge Trophy presented by Mrs. G. Little to the winner.

Class 5 Yearling Colt or Gelding.

Class 6 Yearling Filly.

Class 7 2 & 3 year old Gelding.

The Oakdene Challenge Cup presented by Mr & Mrs de St. Croix for the best young gelding.
The two highest placed eligible ponies in classes 5 & 7 to compete.

Class 8 2 & 3 year old Colt.
The Boveycombe Buckthorn Memorial Trophy presented by Mrs. A. Billiau, Australia to the winner.

Class 9 2 year old Filly.
Marankie Farm Stud Trophy presented by Mr. & Mrs. F. Bannan, Australia to the winner.

Class 10 3 year old Filly.

Youngstock Championship: 1st and 2nd prize winners from classes 5 – 10 to compete.

The N.P.S. Dartmoor Youngstock Challenge Cup presented by Mrs. R. M. Taylor to the Champion.

The Dalby Challenge Cup presented by Mrs. G. Dalby for best Devon-bred pony from classes 5 – 10.

Class 11 Sweet Dreams Class. Any pony, any age owned by a member who does not possess more than 5 Dartmoor Ponies (excluding foals).

Class 12 Novice Youngstock & Owner. 1, 2 & 3 year old Filly, Gelding and Yearling Colt. For novice ponies and owners, neither pony nor owner to have won a first prize in hand at the Dartmoor Pony Society Championship Show (excluding foal classes).
The Trewassick Cup presented by Mr. & Mrs. A G. Belcher to the winner.

Class 13 Novice Brood Mare, 4 years old & over with own foal at foot. For mares which have not won a first prize in a Dartmoor class at a Star Show with a foal at foot prior to the 1st January of the current year.

Class 14 Foal by a registered Dartmoor stallion and out of a mare shown in class 13.

Class 15 Open Brood Mare, 4 years old and over with own foal at foot.

Class 16 Foal by a registered Dartmoor stallion and out of a mare shown in class 15.

Brood Mare & Foal Championships: 1st and 2nd prize winners from classes 13 – 16 to compete.

The Boveycombe Challenge Trophy presented by Mrs. M. I. Gould for the best brood mare.

The Dunmere Challenge Cup presented by Mrs. Fielding & Mrs. Green for the best foal.

Supplementary Registered – for the best supplementary registered pony.

The 2 highest placed eligible ponies in classes 1, 2, 5 – 13, 15 & 17 to compete.

The Senruf Trophy presented by Mrs. M. Furness to the winner.

Lloyds Bank Novice for the best novice. Those eligible are ponies which have never won a First Prize in any In Hand Dartmoor class at any show (except foal classes) prior to the closing date of entries. The 2 highest placed eligible ponies from classes 1 – 10, 13, 15 & 17 to compete.

The Shilstone Rocks Challenge Cup presented by Mr. Reep & Mrs. Newbolt-Young to the winner.

Male Championship – 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 3 – 5, 7, 8 & 17.

The Janus Challenge Cup presented by Miss. S. E. Ferguson to the Champion stallion or colt.

Female Championship – 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 1, 2, 6, 9, 10, 13 & 15.

The Carew Challenge Cup presented by Mrs. Carew to the Champion.

Supreme In Hand Championship – Male & Female Champions and Reserves only are required.

The Dartmoor Pony Challenge Cup presented by Lady Anne Lytton & Dr E. L. Roberts to the Supreme Champion.

The Hisley Challenge Cup presented by Mrs. Jones & Miss Roberts for Reserve Supreme Champion.

NPS/Kilmannan Stud M&M In Hand Silver Medal Rosette Championship:

A Silver Medal Rosette is offered by the National Pony Society for the best registered pony in the In Hand section. The Sponsor's Rosette is also awarded to the pony receiving the qualification.

NOTE: *All Part-Bred entries at this show must either be registered in the Part-Bred section of the DPS Studbook or have their Passport overstamped by the DPS.*

Part-Bred Championship: 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 19 & 20.
A **Challenge Cup** presented by Mrs. G.A. Wright to the Champion.

The Cave Penny Challenge Cup for the best pony from classes 19 & 20 which is at least 50% Dartmoor and all the rest of its breeding is either Thoroughbred or Arab. No other breeding is acceptable.

NPS Mountain and Moorland Qualifying Rounds: These classes are judged under the current Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud Books. Part-Breds are not eligible. **The first placed pony in each class will qualify for the final. Qualification may pass down to third place if the first and second ponies are already qualified.**

NPS/Rosettes Direct Home Produced Ridden Championship: Riders of Home Produced ponies (see definition in current NPS Rules Book) **wear a white arm band** in classes where this is indicated. These ponies are then eligible to qualify for the final.

Class 21 **Novice Leading Rein:** Open to registered mares & geldings four years old & over not exceeding 122cm. Not to have won a first prize in any open ridden class prior to the 1st January of the current year. Riders must have attained their 3rd birthday but not their 9th birthday before the 1st January of the current year and the leader has to be 16 years old or over. To be shown in a snaffle bit.
A **Merit Rosette** will be awarded to all riders not placed.
The Buckley Challenge Cup presented by Mr & Mrs. Buckley to the winner.

Class 22 **The NPS/Showing Classic M&M Leading Rein National Championship**
Open to registered mares & geldings four years old & over not exceeding 122cm. Riders must have attained their 3rd birthday but not their 9th birthday before 1st January of the current year and the leader has to be 16 years old or over. To be shown in a snaffle bit. A **Merit Rosette** will be awarded to all riders not placed.
NPS/Rosettes Direct Home Produced Ridden Championship wear white arm bands.
The Michelmass Challenge Cup presented by Mrs. J. Montgomery to the winner.

Class 23 **Beginners First Ridden** open to mares & geldings four years old & over. Riders must have attained their 3rd birthday but not their 10th birthday before 1st January of the current year. Ponies must be ridden in a suitable bridle.
An attendant may accompany but not lead the pony in the ring.
A **Merit Rosette** will be awarded to all riders not placed.

The Guillebaud Challenge Trophy presented by the Guillebaud family and Mr. & Mrs. P.S. Taylor to the winner.

Class 28 Horse of the Year Show NPS/Baileys Horse Feeds Mountain & Moorland Ridden Pony Championship Qualifier 2016

This class is also a qualifier for the

NPS/Ringside Stud M&M Open Ridden National Championship.

NPS/Rosettes Direct Home Produced Ridden Championship- wear white arm bands.

Rosettes to 10th place.

This is a qualifying class for the NPS/Baileys Horse Feeds Ridden Mountain & Moorland Pony of the Year Championship, Horse of the Year Show, N.E.C., Birmingham, 5th – 9th October 2016. The highest placed pony (not already qualified) from the first three in the final judging will qualify for Horse of the Year Show 2016, subject to verification of qualification by the Horse of the Year Show Office. Qualification will not pass below 3rd place.

This competition is open to stallions, mares and geldings, four years old & over, registered in & complying with the showing requirements of the Dartmoor Pony Society. **Ponies must not exceed 127cm as stipulated by the Dartmoor Pony Society.** This class will be run in accordance with the general rules set out in the Horse of the Year Show rulebook, a copy of which can be downloaded from www.hoys.co.uk. Owners & riders must be members of the Dartmoor Pony Society, the BSPS, the NPS, Ponies (UK), The Showing Register (TSR).

Ponies that qualify for this Championship at the Horse of the Year Show 2016 must hold a valid JMB Full Height or Annual Certificate, a copy of which must be sent to Grandstand Media Ltd at the time of entry to Horse of the Year Show. JMB certificates are not required to enter this qualifier. Riders can be any age except riders of stallions must have attained their 12th birthday before 1st January in the current year.

Correct riding attire must be worn. Spurs are not allowed. Whips must not exceed 30”.

Judges may only judge one Horse of the Year Show M&M Ridden qualifying competition during the current year. Marks will be awarded in the following way:

Show, freedom of action	50 maximum,
Breed type & conformation	50 maximum.

In the case of equality, the pony with the highest show/freedom of action mark will be deemed the winner. If there is still equality at this point then the judges’ decision will be final.

Split Classes

1. Where there are more than 20 entries forward in a class, the judges may split the class into sections according to the circumstances on the day.
2. Each section must be marked & the top five ponies with the highest marks go forward to a final judging. The marks are not to be displayed at this point & no rosettes awarded.
3. For the final judging the top ponies should be invited back into the ring & lined up in any order. No further show will be given.
4. The judges should then refer to their original marks. In the case of equality the pony with the highest show/freedom of action mark will be deemed the winner. If there still be equality at this point then the judges’ decision will be final.

Open Ridden Championship – 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 25 – 28.

NPS/The Minns M&M Ridden Silver Medal Rosette Championship:

A Silver Medal Rosette is offered by the National Pony Society for the best registered pony from classes 25 – 28 in the Ridden section.

Class 32 Novice Working Hunter Pony – Fully & Supplementary registered stallions, mares & geldings, four years old & over. Not to have won a first prize in any WHP class prior to the 1st January of the current year. Maximum height of fences 2' 0".

A **Dartmoor Pony Society Rosette** will be awarded to the winner of the class.

Class 33 Open Working Hunter Pony – Fully & Supplementary registered stallions, mares & geldings, four years old & over. Maximum height of fences 2' 3".

A **Dartmoor Pony Society Rosette** will be awarded to the winner of the class.

Class 34 Part-Bred Working Hunter Pony – stallions, mares & geldings, four years old & over. *Eligibility: see note after class 20.* Maximum height of fences 2' 3".

Working Hunter Pony Championship – 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 32 – 34.

The Roeves Challenge Cup presented by Mrs. E. Roeves to the Champion.

Class 35 **Leading Rein Working Hunter Pony** – Fully, Supplementary registered & Part-Bred mares or geldings, four years old & over not exceeding 122cm (Part-Breds 128 cm). Riders must have attained their 5th birthday but not their 11th birthday by 1st January of the current year. Maximum height of fences approx. 1'3".

A **Dartmoor Pony Society Rosette** will be awarded to the highest placed Dartmoor pony.
A **Special Part-Bred Rosette** will be awarded to the highest placed Part-Bred pony.

A **Special Part-Bred Rosette** will be awarded to the highest placed Part-Bred pony.

Class 38 **Dressage** – Fully, Supplementary registered and Part-Bred stallions, mares or geldings four years old & over. Rider any age. Pony Club Novice Test 2009.

A **Special Part-Bred Rosette** will be awarded to the highest placed Part-Bred pony.

Class 39 **Dressage – Leading Rein/First Ridden** - Fully, Supplementary registered & Part-Bred mare or gelding, four years old & over. Not exceeding 128cm. Riders must have attained their 3rd birthday but not their 12th birthday by 1st January of the current year. Pony Club Walk & Trot Test 2013.

A **Dartmoor Pony Society Rosette** will be awarded to the highest placed Dartmoor pony.
A **Special Part-Bred Rosette** will be awarded to the highest placed Part-Bred Pony.
A **Merit Rosette** will be awarded to all Riders not placed.
The Concours de Dressage Challenge Trophy presented by the Association du Poney Dartmoor to the highest placed Dartmoor pony.

On arrival at the Showground, competitors are asked to book with the Dressage Steward times which suit their other classes.

RULES AND CONDITIONS

1. Dartmoor Pony Owners **MUST** be fully paid up members of the Dartmoor Pony Society (except for Part-bred and class 28) & all ponies must be fully or supplementary registered Dartmoors unless otherwise stated.
2. The Judge's decision is final. The Judges will be instructed to withhold any ordinary or special prize where there is evident lack of merit.
3. The Society reserves the right to take the opinion of a Veterinary Surgeon on any pony exhibited.
4. The officials do not hold themselves responsible for any accident which may occur on the showground to spectators, competitors or animals. The organisers of this show have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the Organisers and all the Officials and Stewards.
5. Any persons wishing to lodge an objection having reference to any persons or exhibit, shall do so in writing within one hour of the completion of the class or championship and at the same time shall deposit the sum of £20.00 with the Show Secretary. If an investigation by the Championship Show Committee shows that the objection is not justified the deposit shall be forfeited & paid into the funds of the Dartmoor Pony Society. The Committee's decision shall be final in all respects.
6. No owner may knowingly show a pony in a class where the judge has owned/bred/sold/leased/broken/trained or produced that pony or where the pony has been owned/bred/sold/leased/broken/trained or produced by the judge's immediate family*, partner, employer or employee. An owner may not show under a judge for whom (s)he has produced/broken/trained an equine since 1st Oct in the previous year. (* Immediate family includes husband, wife, child, grandchild, brother, sister, parent, grandparent.)
7. Please check Novice status very carefully. Spot checks will be made to verify status.
8. The Championship Show Committee reserves the right to cancel or amalgamate any class/classes and to refuse entries. Non-members may not remove trophies from the showground.
9. **NO NOMINATIONS & NO SUBSTITUTIONS ALLOWED.** Entry fees are non-refundable.
10. Passports must accompany ponies exhibited at the show.
11. All Foals must be at least 3 weeks old on the day of the show.
12. Handlers of ponies in the In Hand classes aged 14 years and under **MUST** wear correctly secured British Standard skull caps/riding hats & safe footwear.
13. Correctly secured current British Standard skull caps/riding hats **MUST** be worn at all times when mounted. A rider whose hat comes off will be disqualified. A rider whose strap comes undone whilst competing must on penalty of disqualification, refasten it before continuing. The rider may stop without penalty to refasten the strap. Body protectors are recommended for classes involving jumping.
14. The minimum age for any child jumping is 5 on 1st January of the current year.
15. Whips/canes must not exceed an overall length of 75cm (30"). The use of spurs is forbidden.
16. Only Part-Bred ponies can be shown plaited.
17. A fall of pony or rider whilst mounted in any class will result in disqualification. They must leave the ring dismounted.
18. All NPS classes will be run under NPS Rules except in the Horse of the Year Show qualifying class where, if there is a conflict of rules, HOYS Rules will take precedence over NPS rules.
19. Any competitor seen practising over the WHP Course will be disqualified.
20. Dogs **MUST** be kept on a lead at all times.

STALLIONS & COLTS:

21. All Dartmoor Stallions and Colts 3 years old and over must hold a current DPS Licence.
All Part-bred Stallions and Colts 2 years old and over must hold a current stallion Licence.
22. Handlers of stallions or colts must have attained their 14th birthday by 1st January of the current year.
23. Riders of stallions must have attained their 12th birthday before 1st January in the current year for NPS classes, their 11th birthday before 1st January of the current year for DPS-only classes.
24. In all NPS classes stallions & colts 2 years old or over must display stallion bridle markers.

DIRECTIONS TO THE SHOWFIELD

FROM THE EAST OR NORTH

From the M5 Junction 31 follow signs onto the A30 West, signed to Okehampton/Bodmin. Whiddon Down is approximately 17 miles from Junction 31.

Continue along the dual carriageway to the exit signed for Whiddon Down and Moretonhampstead. The Showground is approximately three quarters of a mile from the Junction on the A30 at Whiddon Down.

In Whiddon Down, at a mini roundabout, take the A382 signed Moretonhampstead and Chagford and in 200 metres turn right, the entrance to the Showground is then on the left.

There will be signs directing traffic to the show from the mini roundabout.

FROM THE WEST

Take the A30, heading towards Exeter.

Turn off at the exit signed for Whiddon Down and Moretonhampstead.

The Showground is approximately three quarters of a mile from the Junction on the A30 at Whiddon Down.

In Whiddon Down, at a mini roundabout take the A382 signed Moretonhampstead and Chagford and in 200 metres turn right, the entrance to the Showground is then on the left.

There will be signs directing traffic to the show from the mini roundabout.
